Trials (James 1:1-12)

What to do when going through a trial?

- Have the right outlook- Count (James 1:2)
 - Your outlook will affect your outcome. The way you see it will determine how you get out of it.
- Have Joy (James 1:2)
- Ask for Help in Faith (Verse 5)
 - ⁵ If any of you lack wisdom, let him ask of God, that giveth to all men liberally, and upbraideth not; and it shall be given him.
 - Wisdom begins with knowing what God said about it.
 - Wisdom is A Gift from God.
 - Wisdom is the ability to apply spiritual truth to life's circumstances.
 - God Wisdom's is wiser than your biggest problem.

Having faith means not being double minded. A double-minded person has the following straits:

- Two minds or two souls
- Restless Thoughts
- Confusion
- Conflict with himself/herself
- Unstable
- Going two directions at once- It means to respond to your problem with an earthly and heavenly perspective.

Sticky Statement: Sometimes it's not the trial, that paralyzes you, it's your thinking.

James 1:9-11 (James gives examples of responding to life with wisdom by using the poor and the rich)

What happens after I pass the trial (test)?

- There are five types of crowns that we can receive in the kingdom.
 - Crown of Mastery (1 Corinthians 9:24-25)
 - Crown of Rejoicing (First Thessalonians 2:19)
 - Crown of Glory (1 Peter 5:2-4)
 - Crown of Life (James 1:12)
 - Crown of Righteousness (2 Timothy 4:7-8)
- Crown is the Greek word stephanos which means badge of royalty.
 - In the Kingdom, crosses before crown.
- o The Crown of Life
 - This crown is given to those who were faithful in suffering and enduring trials.
